

Alpine National Park

Located in north eastern Victoria, approximately 350 km from Melbourne, the Alpine National Park includes:

- Victoria's highest peaks Mt. Bogong,
 Mt. Feathertop, Mt. Nelse and Mt. Fainter
- Rare and threatened flora and fauna species
- · Magnificent Alpine Ash forests
- Coloured twisted trunks of snowgums
- · Alpine herb fields and snowgrass plains
- · Snow covered landscapes
- · Profusion of wildflowers in summer
- · Historic cattlemen's huts

- · Environmental monitoring

You'll need camping equipment and food to stay overnight, strong boots, warm clothes, good humour and lots of enthusiasm!
